The »European Art Cinema Day« will take place every year in Autumn.

European Art 09 Cinema Day 10 2016

Background

The *»European Art Cinema Day*« will show the strength and importance of European cinemas, the cultural enrichment they provide as well as the economic activity they bring with them. With more than 100 million film-goers art cinemas irreplaceably contribute to the programming diversity, the discovery and promotion of young talent and the cultural exchange in Europe.

On this special day, the CICAE will show that movie theatres are still public cultural meeting points and centres of attraction – with an important social function in their neighbourhood, rural environment or region.

The *»European Art Cinema Day*« will seek to promote innovative approaches to attract new audiences from all age groups to European film. To do so, the CICAE and the national associations will develop new programming and marketing ideas together with the cinemas.

Art cinemas exist (almost) throughout Europe. In every country where supporting structures and organisations exist, one can observe greater cinema and film diversity linked to a broader anchoring of European film. Therefore this project should support the cinemas in countries without national associations and contribute to developing structures and reinforcing the visibility of European film.

Initiator

The CICAE – International Art Cinemas Association – is a network of national cinema associations, independent cinemas, festivals and film distributors. Since its creation in 1955 in Wiesbaden by the German, French, Dutch and Swiss art cinemas associations, the CICAE has been advocating cultural diversity in cinemas and festivals, and promoting the distribution of important films from all countries.
